How Super Bowl Pool Works

The rules are simple to follow. At the end of each quarter, the last digit for each team represents the winner. Examples:

If the 1st quarter is only a single digit score for each team, then those are the winning numbers for the quarter, e.g., Panthers 3 (NFC) – Broncos 7 (AFC) and the person having the corresponding numbers NFC 3 and AFC 7 is the winner. If it's a double digit score, i.e., NFC 10 – AFC 10, you use the last digit of each team's score, i.e., NFC 0 – AFC 0, and the person having the corresponding numbers NFC Panthers 0 and AFC Broncos 0 is the winner. See chart below for assistance (this is only an example).

Note: **The Final Score represents the Fourth Quarter (including Overtime – if there is OT).**

End of	Panther s (NFC)	Broncos (AFC)	Explanation
1 st Quarter	3	7	If you have 3 for Panthers and 7 for Broncos, you're a winner.
2 nd Quarter	10	10	Use the last digit for each team. If you have 0 for Panthers and 0 for the Broncos, you win.
3 rd Quarter	20	10	Notice the last digit for each team did not change - 0 for Panthers and 0 for Broncos, then the 2 nd Quarter winner wins again (Congratulations, and yes, it can happen to you). How did it happen? Panthers already had 10 points from the 2 nd Quarter. But during the 3 rd Quarter Panthers scored a touchdown for 6 points, then kicked the extra point which was good for 1 point and then later in the same quarter the Panthers kicked a field goal for an additional 3 points, giving Panthers 10 additional points added to the previous 10, giving a total of 20 points for Panthers. Unfortunately, the Broncos were unable to score any points which left them at 10. End of 3 rd quarter score is Panthers 20 – Broncos 10
4 th Quarter	27	24	If you have 7 for Panthers and 4 for the Broncos, you're the winner. Note: If there is Overtime, the final score of the game represents the 4th Quarter.
